







Alfred Escher (1819–1882)

Architect of modern Switzerland, he united economic vision, political sovereignty, and popular will. It is within this tradition of Swiss independence that *Swiss Sovereignty* takes root.







A Free, Sovereign, and Rooted Switzerland

Our Vision:

That Switzerland remains the master of its own destiny, true to its history and founding principles.

We aim to:

- Preserve **historical neutrality, monetary independence, economic autonomy**, and the **primacy of national law**.
- **Protect Swiss institutions** from being diluted into supranational mechanisms lacking democratic legitimacy.
- **Reject any submission to the interests of foreign powers**, international organizations, or technocratic bodies.
- **Anchor our future in a living sovereignty**, shared by the people and upheld by strong institutions.



Sovereignty Under Attack

- **Increasing Pressure from the European Union and the United States**
- **Financial dependence** (USD reserves, foreign markets)
- **Gradual loss of technological and digital control**
- **Outsourcing of sovereign functions** (borders, security, data)
- **Legal Standardisation through Undemocratic Norms**

The imposition of foreign legal frameworks through supranational organisations (FATF, UN, ECHR, WHO, OECD), often via *soft law*, without popular vote or democratic legitimacy.

- **Informational and Media Subordination**

Swiss media are heavily funded by the federal government, foreign foundations, and ideological actors. The result: growing alignment with globalist narratives at the expense of pluralism.



Political Sovereignty Under Threat

- **Weakened Neutrality (NATO, EU, International Sanctions)**

Switzerland is increasingly aligning itself with NATO and the EU, weakening its historical neutrality.

- **Bypassing of Direct Democracy (Treaties, Soft Law, Imposed Norms)**

International treaties and standards are enforced without a vote, draining direct democracy of its substance.

- **Risk of Becoming a Satellite State, Dependent on Foreign Structures**

Switzerland is losing its ability to decide independently, increasingly influenced by foreign entities.

- **Concentration of Executive Power**

The federal administration governs through ordinances, bypassing both Parliament and the people.

- **Loss of Fiscal and Financial Sovereignty**

Taxation and financial regulation are dictated by the OECD, FATF, and Brussels.

- **Internal Political Fragmentation**

Swiss actors supported from abroad are undermining national unity and federal sovereignty.



Economic & Monetary Sovereignty at Risk 1/2

- **Dependence on the US Dollar and Foreign Markets**

Switzerland's economic stability is weakened by excessive USD reserves and systemic exposure to geopolitically unstable markets.

- **Strategic Exports Threatened by Tariffs and Sanctions**

Key sectors — watchmaking, pharmaceuticals, machinery, gold — are vulnerable to trade and regulatory retaliation driven by foreign powers.

- **Loss of Control over Swiss Gold and National Reserves**

A portion of refined gold, exported or stored abroad, escapes any coordinated sovereign strategy.

- **Need for a Sovereign Fund in Gold and Real Assets**

There is an urgent need to create a strategic fund to shield Switzerland from monetary crises and geopolitical shocks.

- **Digital Currency = Foreign Monetary Control**

The introduction of a Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) would threaten the autonomy of the Swiss franc and pave the way for total transaction traceability.



Economic & Monetary Sovereignty at Risk 2/2

- **Erosion of National Ownership of Strategic Assets**

More and more companies, farmland, and critical infrastructure are falling under foreign control, weakening our real economic independence.

- **Weakening of SMEs and Impossible Industrial Relocalisation**

Administrative, tax, and energy burdens are suffocating Swiss SMEs, making genuine industrial reshoring impossible.

- **Hidden Growth of Federal and Cantonal Public Debt**

Behind the appearance of fiscal stability, off-balance-sheet commitments and loan guarantees are exploding, threatening medium-term fiscal sustainability.

- **Risk of Economic Blackmail by Foreign Powers**

The extraterritoriality of U.S. law and European regulatory pressure expose Switzerland to constant blackmail over its financial and industrial sectors.

- **Monetary Policy Disconnected from National Interest**

The Swiss National Bank (SNB) operates according to global logic, without a strategic orientation defined by the Swiss people or coordination with the country's real interests.



Digital and Security Sovereignty at Risk

- **Cloud, Strategic Data, and Infrastructure Under Foreign Jurisdiction**

Sensitive data from the administration, hospitals, and Swiss companies are stored on servers controlled by multinational corporations subject to U.S. law (Cloud Act, etc.).

- **Military Dependence (F-35, U.S.-Controlled Contracts)**

Swiss military purchases like the F-35 create logistical, contractual, and technological dependencies on the United States, weakening our strategic autonomy.

- **Risk of Interference in Governance**

Access to data flows, critical infrastructure, or command chains paves the way for invisible forms of interference or surveillance.

- **Absence of Swiss Cyber Sovereignty**

Cybersecurity for public and private systems relies on external—often foreign—solutions, leaving Switzerland without real control over its digital vulnerabilities.

- **Technological Standardisation Imposed from Abroad**

EU norms, ISO regulations, NATO or OECD directives: Switzerland adopts foreign technical frameworks without debate, undermining its technological independence.



Protecting the Spirit of Switzerland

- **Swiss Identity Weakened by International Dilution**

Switzerland's unique cultural, linguistic, and institutional character is being eroded by global dynamics that erase national specificities.

- **Threat to Popular Rights (Referendums Emptied of Meaning)**

International agreements, soft law, and foreign courts bypass or neutralize the outcomes of Swiss popular votes.

- **The Need to Pass On a Free and Independent Switzerland to the Youth**

Without historical memory or civic awareness, future generations risk accepting subordination to foreign structures as the “new normal.”

- **Fragmentation of Social and Linguistic Cohesion**

The imposition of uniform external norms undermines the social pact and the balance between Swiss regions and cultures.

- **Rise of a Passive and Disconnected Citizenship**

The erosion of popular rights leads to civic demobilization and a growing loss of trust in democratic institutions.



Key Drivers of the Sovereignty Revival 1/2

- **Inform and Mobilize Citizens**

Disseminate clear, multilingual, and independent information to raise awareness across all three regions of the country.

- **Create Monitoring and Analysis Tools**

Produce reports, tracking dashboards, and documented files to expose violations of Swiss sovereignty.

- **Launch Citizen and Popular Initiatives**

Use the available democratic instruments to counter legal or institutional subordination projects.

- **Build Alliances with Other Sovereignist Movements**

Create a common front with Swiss and European actors who share a commitment to defending freedom and sovereignty.



Key Drivers of the Sovereignty Revival 2/2

- **Build an Active and Decentralized Citizen Network**

Unite volunteers in every canton to carry the message, relay campaigns, and root the mobilisation in local communities.

- **Undertake Targeted Legal Actions**

File appeals, expose institutional abuses, and defend popular rights before national courts.

- **Establish a Strong Presence in Public Space**

Use visuals, symbols, events, and on-the-ground actions to make the sovereignist resistance visible.

- **Educate a New Generation of Sovereign Citizens**

Develop training modules, conferences, discussion circles, and publications to pass on the foundations of Swiss sovereignty, neutrality, and direct democracy.



Key Priorities for Regaining Sovereignty

- **Protect Neutrality and Popular Rights**

Defend our unique model of direct democracy and our rejection of all foreign military or legal interference.

- **Reorient Economic Policy Toward National Interest**

Prioritize Swiss SMEs, local production, strategic autonomy, and the protection of vital sectors.

- **Ensure a Sound Currency Backed by Gold**

Restore monetary stability by protecting the Swiss franc from digital dilution and imported inflation.

- **Defend Our Borders, Data, and Infrastructure**

Regain control over vital networks (digital, logistical, territorial) in the face of external interference.

- **Secure Long-Term Independence**

Build resilient sovereignty rooted in national law, real assets, and collective identity.

- **Reinvest in the Cultural and Educational Spheres**

Restore meaning, pride, and continuity to Swiss identity through schools, media, and cultural institutions.

- **Establish a Strong Institutional Counterpower**

Create a foundation, an observatory, and regional branches capable of acting long-term in defense of sovereignty.



Take Back Control. Now.

- **Switzerland Stands at a Historic Crossroads**

Our unique model is under threat from a gradual loss of sovereignty, neutrality, and democratic control.

- **Swiss Sovereignty acts so that citizens can take back control**

In response to the erasure of popular power, we are building a civic, independent, and rooted force.

- **Without sovereignty, there is neither freedom nor democracy**

The right to freely decide our laws, our currency, and our alliances is the foundation of any lasting liberty.

- **Every day lost weakens our ability to resist**

Erosion is slow but constant: failing to act today means accepting the loss of choice tomorrow.

- **Joining the movement means choosing to defend Switzerland**

Getting involved, contributing, or spreading the message is taking part in a historic reconquest — legitimate, peaceful, and led by the people.
